

NIGHTWATCH — Iran / Strait of Hormuz Crisis

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Hormuz whiplash completed its full cycle overnight. What began Friday afternoon as a dramatic opening — Araghchi declaring the Strait “completely open,” oil crashing 12%, markets hitting all-time highs — reversed within hours as the IRGC reasserted “**strict military control**” and accused the United States of “piracy and maritime robbery.” Then the violence started. IRGC gunboats **fired on a tanker** 20 nautical miles northeast of Oman without radio warning. A separate container vessel was hit by an unknown projectile. Two Indian-flagged ships were attacked, prompting India to summon Iran’s ambassador. Five Indian and Greek oil tankers carrying **8.3 million barrels** performed U-turns near Dubai. A convoy of approximately **20 merchant ships** — the largest attempted transit since the war began, including three CMA CGM container vessels that had already agreed to pay \$2M IRGC tolls — aborted passage entirely. The overnight window produced the war’s first kinetic incidents during the ceasefire period and confirmed what the previous SITREP diagnosed: **the IRGC, not the Foreign Ministry, controls the Strait.**

Trump responded with an explicit **Wednesday bombing ultimatum**: “The blockade remains, and unfortunately we will have to start dropping bombs again” if no deal is reached by the ceasefire’s expiry. He simultaneously claimed a deal is “very close” and that there are no remaining “sticking points” — while Iran’s Ghalibaf accused Trump of making “**seven false claims in one hour**” and warned the Strait “will not remain open” if the blockade continues. Iran flatly denied any agreement on uranium transfer; Trump insisted the US will retrieve “all nuclear dust” using “the biggest excavators you can imagine.” On the \$20B frozen-assets deal reported by Axios: Trump said “no money changes hands”; Iran said uranium “will not be transferred anywhere.” Every major claim remains formally denied by the other side.

Monday talks in Islamabad remain **uncertain**. CNN and Pakistani sources report both delegations expected Sunday; Iran’s Tasnim agency says Tehran has “not yet committed” and Deputy FM Khatibzadeh stated from Antalya that no date will be set until a “framework of understanding” is finalized. Pakistan’s Army Chief Munir completed a 3-day Tehran visit meeting the president, FM,

Ghalibaf, and the military command. The ceasefire expires in **3 days**. The War Powers deadline is April 28. Iran's storage fills in 2-3 weeks. Europe has 6 weeks of jet fuel. Every clock continues to tick.

Three structural developments overnight. **First:** the US Treasury extended the Russian oil sanctions waiver through **May 16** — directly contradicting Bessent's statement 48 hours earlier that waivers would not be renewed. Russia's special envoy said the extension covers another 100 million barrels (200M cumulative). Democrats called it "shameful." India's Russian crude imports tripled from \$1.5B (Feb) to \$5.8B (March). **Second:** a French UNIFIL peacekeeper was **killed in a Hezbollah ambush** in southern Lebanon — Sergeant-Chief Florian Montorio, hit by direct fire at close range during a patrol to an isolated post. Macron blamed Hezbollah. This is the most significant kinetic development in the Lebanon ceasefire zone and risks fracturing the French-led Hormuz coalition. **Third:** \$760 million in Brent futures were sold in a **one-minute window** 20 minutes before Araghchi's Hormuz announcement — the third such suspicious pre-announcement trade. The SEC has opened a formal probe; The Guardian documented over \$1 billion in accurate war-related prediction market bets, including a single user "Magamyman" who made \$553K on Khamenei's death.

The 50-day war has now produced **500+ million barrels** of lost oil supply worth **\$50 billion**. Gulf Arab crude output fell ~8M bpd in March (~40% decline). Jet fuel exports from Gulf states collapsed from 19.6M barrels (Feb) to 4.1M barrels (Mar-Apr combined). Physical Dated Brent trades at **\$120/barrel** — 65% above pre-war levels — while paper futures show \$88-90. The divergence between what markets say oil costs and what countries actually pay to receive it is the widest in the war's history.

10 MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

1. IRGC reverses Hormuz opening, fires on tankers, forces 20-ship convoy to abort

Iran's Khatam Al-Anbiya command reimposed "strict military control" over the Strait, reversing Araghchi's "completely open" declaration. The IRGC outlined four conditions: only non-military ships on Iranian-designated routes, IRGC authorization required, ~\$2M transit tolls, and all rules contingent on the truce holding. IRGC gunboats then fired on a tanker near Oman without radio warning; a separate cargo ship was struck by an unknown projectile. Two Indian-flagged vessels were attacked, prompting India to summon Iran's ambassador. Five Indian/Greek tankers carrying 8.3M barrels turned back. A ~20-ship convoy — the largest since the war — aborted. Only 5 cargo ships and 1 empty cruise had transited during the brief "open" window. Zero oil tankers crossed. Iranian state media called Araghchi's X post "bad and incomplete." The IRGC warned that if the ceasefire collapses, the Strait returns to "Forty Day War" status with total prohibition ([DW](#), [WSJ](#), [Handelsblatt](#)).

2. Trump threatens to "start dropping bombs again" Wednesday — ceasefire 3 days from expiry

Speaking on Air Force One, Trump stated: "The blockade remains, and unfortunately we will have to start dropping bombs again" if no deal by Wednesday. He may not extend the ceasefire. He simultaneously claimed "pretty good

news” about Iran and said things are “going very well.” CENTCOM reported 21 ships turned back since the blockade began April 13. The Wednesday deadline — the ceasefire’s final day — now functions as the war’s most consequential calendar event ([Asharq Al-Awsat](#), [ZDF](#), [Le Monde](#)).

3. Ghalibaf: Trump made “7 false claims in 1 hour” — uranium “sacred as Iranian soil”

Ghalibaf posted on X that all seven of Trump’s recent claims were lies and warned: “If the blockade continues, the Strait of Hormuz will not remain open.” Iran’s FM spokesman Baghaei stated enriched uranium “will not be transferred anywhere” and described it as “as sacred as Iranian soil.” Baghaei added: “The transfer of enriched uranium from Iran to the United States has never been discussed in negotiations.” Trump insisted the US will retrieve “all the Nuclear Dust, created by our great B2 Bombers” using “the biggest excavators you can imagine.” The gap between these positions is not a negotiation — it is a factual dispute about what was agreed ([Middle East Eye](#), [Fox News](#), [BFMTV](#)).

4. French UNIFIL peacekeeper killed in Hezbollah ambush in southern Lebanon

Sergeant-Chief Florian Montorio of the 17th Parachute Engineer Regiment was killed and three soldiers wounded in an ambush at close range during a patrol to an isolated UNIFIL post in Deir-Kifa. Armed Forces Minister Vautrin: Montorio was “immediately hit by a direct shot with a light weapon.” Macron stated “everything suggests that the responsibility for this attack lies with Hezbollah.” Hezbollah denied involvement. This follows the death of Adjutant-Chief Arnaud Frion, killed by a pro-Iranian militia drone in Erbil. The ceasefire is producing casualties on both sides of the Lebanon line ([Ouest-France](#), [Le Monde](#)).

5. US reverses on Russian oil waivers — extends to May 16 despite Bessent’s denial

The Treasury Department issued a new waiver covering sanctioned Russian oil loaded on tankers, extending through May 16. This directly contradicts Bessent’s statement two days prior that waivers would not be renewed. Russia’s special envoy Dmitriev said the extension affects another 100 million barrels (200M cumulative). India’s Russian crude imports tripled: \$1.54B (Feb) to \$5.8B (March); India now takes 38% of Russian oil (second to China at 51%). Democrats Schumer, Warren, and Shaheen called it “shameful.” The IEA reports Russia has nearly doubled its oil revenues under relaxed sanctions ([Tagesschau](#), [NDTV](#), [Dawn](#)).

6. Monday Islamabad talks uncertain — CNN says yes, Tasnim says Iran uncommitted

CNN reports US and Iranian delegations expected in Islamabad Sunday, with talks commencing Monday. But Iran’s Tasnim agency says Tehran has “not yet committed.” Deputy FM Khatibzadeh stated from Antalya that no date will be set until a “framework of understanding” is finalized, and warned against talks that “lead to failure and serve as a pretext for further escalation.” Pakistan’s Munir completed 3 days in Tehran; PM Sharif wrapped Saudi/Qatar/Turkey tour. A Pakistani source told Reuters progress has been made toward an MOU with a comprehensive agreement within 60 days. The ceasefire expires Wednesday ([AA](#), [ABP Live](#), [Sky News Arabia](#)).

7. \$760M suspicious oil trade in one-minute window — third pre-announcement incident; SEC probe

On April 17, 7,990 Brent crude oil futures contracts were sold in a one-minute window starting at 12:24 PM — approximately 20 minutes before Araghchi’s X post declaring the Strait open. Value: ~\$760 million. This follows \$950M in pre-ceasefire trades and \$500M 15 minutes before a Trump energy post. Sen. Elizabeth Warren called

these “terrible examples of insiders manipulating the market.” The SEC has opened a formal probe at CME and ICE. The Guardian documented over \$1 billion in accurate prediction market bets on war developments, including single user “Magamyman” who netted \$553K on Khamenei’s death ([Hani](#), [N-TV](#), [The Guardian](#)).

8. 50-day war: 500M+ barrels lost, \$50B destroyed, largest energy disruption in modern history

Reuters/Kpler data: 500+ million barrels of crude removed from global markets over 50 days. Gulf Arab crude output fell ~8M bpd in March (~40% decline). Jet fuel exports from Gulf states collapsed from 19.6M barrels (Feb) to 4.1M (Mar-Apr combined). Physical Dated Brent at \$120/bbl — 65% above pre-war. North Sea Forties peaked ~\$150. Full tanker recovery could take 3 months (128 tankers carrying 160M barrels must clear Hormuz). Heavy oil fields need 4-5 months; Qatar LNG potentially years. Fed Governor Waller warned the war could cause “permanent” inflation shock ([Pakistan Today](#), [CNN](#), [The Arab Weekly](#)).

9. 49-nation UK-France naval coalition announced for Hormuz — US explicitly excluded

Starmer and Macron confirmed a “strictly peaceful and defensive” mission following a conference with 49 countries, the EU, and the IMO. Over a dozen nations committed assets. Military planning at London’s Northwood HQ next week. The Elysée stated: “The United States has been informed of this meeting, and they have been told they are not part of it.” Trump dismissed the offer: “Stay away... Paper tiger!” Germany committed mine-hunters contingent on ceasefire and UN mandate. IMO Legal Committee formally condemned Iran for Hormuz closure, mining, and attacks on GCC states ([AA](#), [Le Monde](#)).

10. Iran partially reopens eastern airspace — zero international flights materialize

Iran announced partial reopening of eastern airspace and six airports (including two in Tehran) for an 11-hour daily window until April 25. FlightRadar24 showed zero international transit flights more than three hours after the announcement — only one Mahan Air flight from Muscat detected. Airlines continue long detour routes. Aviation war-risk insurance premiums have risen up to 500%. Over 20,000 flights cancelled since the war began; 1,150 flights rerouted daily adding 200,000 km in extra distance ([AA](#), [El Economista](#)).

PIVOT EVENT TRACKER

Pivot 1 – Does China cut a passage deal? (Timeline: Apr 2026)

Current assessment: UNCLEAR – probability STABLE

The IRGC's reversal of Hormuz opening shows the military can override any diplomatic commitment. A China-brokered passage deal requires IRGC buy-in. The Russian oil waiver extension benefits Chinese refiners processing Russian crude. May 14-15 Trump-Xi summit remains the structural catalyst but the IRGC veto makes any maritime arrangement contingent on military, not diplomatic, negotiations.

Pivot 2A – Saudi back-channel to Iran? (Timeline: Jun 2026)

Current assessment: YES – probability UP

Quadrilateral FM meeting completed in Antalya. Munir's 3-day Tehran visit. Sharif's Saudi/Qatar/Turkey tour. Saudi-Pakistan alignment on mediation track is structural.

Pivot 2B – Nuclear sprint to 90%? (Timeline: May 2026)

Current assessment: UNCLEAR – probability trending UP slightly

Iran denying all IAEA inspections. 440 kg HEU at 60%. A massive discrepancy surfaced: IAEA says 180 kg at 20% enrichment; US-Israeli intelligence estimates 1,200 kg. If the latter is correct, Iran is closer to breakout than publicly assessed. Khatibzadeh's "framework of understanding" demand before talks delays the diplomatic track while enrichment potentially continues.

Pivot 3A – Ceasefire deal? (Timeline: Sep–Oct 2026)

Current assessment: YES – probability DOWN from prior cycle

The Hormuz reversal, IRGC kinetic incidents, Ghalibaf's "seven lies" broadside, and Iran's refusal to commit to Monday talks all represent backsliding from the prior SITREP's cautious optimism. Trump's Wednesday bombing threat raises stakes. The MOU framework exists on paper but the IRGC has demonstrated it can veto any diplomatic commitment.

Pivot 3B – US recommit militarily? (Timeline: Aug 2026)

Current assessment: UNCLEAR – probability trending UP

Trump's explicit Wednesday bombing ultimatum is the strongest escalation signal since the ceasefire. IDF has ordered "next operation" preparation. IRGC gunboat attacks create casus belli. But munitions depletion, FMS delays, and 31% economic approval constrain scale.

Pivot 3C – US strike nuclear sites? (Timeline: Jul 2026)

Current assessment: UNCLEAR – probability trending UP

The 20% HEU discrepancy (IAEA 180 kg vs intel 1,200 kg) is a significant new signal. Iran blocking IAEA inspections. Trump's "nuclear dust" rhetoric escalating. If the intelligence estimate is correct, the gap between enrichment and weaponization is narrower than the diplomatic track assumes.

Notable narrative divergences:

- **IRGC vs FM split is the story:** The overnight window made the Iranian civil-military divide publicly visible. Araghchi opened the Strait; the IRGC closed it and fired on tankers. Tasnim criticized the FM. Ghalibaf — parliament speaker, not FM — is issuing the definitive Iranian statements.
- **Trump’s dual messaging:** “Very close” to a deal and “dropping bombs again” Wednesday are stated simultaneously. US media covers both uncritically; European and Russian media treat the contradiction as the story itself.
- **Physical vs paper oil:** The \$120 Dated Brent vs \$88 futures gap is structural. Markets are pricing hope; importers are paying reality.

CONTRADICTIONARY CLAIMS

1. Strait status: “Completely open” → “Strict military control” within hours

- **Araghchi (Friday):** “Completely open for all commercial vessels” ([PBS](#))
- **IRGC (Saturday):** Reimposed “strict management and control”; ships require authorization; fired on tankers ([DW](#))
- **Trump:** “Iran has agreed to never close the Strait again” ([Yonhap](#))
- **Assessment:** Three incompatible claims. The IRGC’s actions — gunboats firing, convoy aborting — are the operational truth.

2. Uranium transfer: “getting all nuclear dust” vs “will not be transferred anywhere”

- **Trump:** US will retrieve “all nuclear dust” with “the biggest excavators” ([AA](#))
- **Iran FM spokesman Baghaei:** “Iran’s enriched uranium will not be transferred anywhere... as sacred as Iranian soil” ([Middle East Eye](#))
- **Assessment:** Logically incompatible. One side is publicly lying about what was agreed — or nothing was agreed.

3. \$20B frozen assets deal: exists vs doesn’t

- **Axios:** \$20B compromise between US \$6B offer and Iran \$27B demand ([Axios](#))
- **Trump:** “No money will be provided in any form whatsoever” ([Al Arabiya](#))
- **Assessment:** The deal framework almost certainly exists in some form but neither principal can publicly acknowledge terms the other denies.

4. Russian oil waiver: “will not renew” → renewed

- **Bessent (Wednesday):** “We will not be renewing the general license” ([Tagesschau](#))
- **Treasury (Friday):** Issued new 30-day waiver through May 16 ([Tagesschau](#))
- **Assessment:** The reversal is unexplained. Energy price pressure from the Iran war forced the administration to maintain Russian oil supply to prevent a global price spike.

5. Monday talks: happening vs “no date set”

- **CNN / Pakistani sources:** Both delegations arriving Sunday; talks Monday ([AA](#))
- **Iran’s Tasnim:** Tehran has “not yet committed” ([Wiwo](#))
- **Khatibzadeh:** No date set until “framework of understanding” finalized ([Sky News Arabia](#))
- **Assessment:** Pakistan is organizing; Iran is conditioning attendance on pre-negotiation concessions. The talks may happen but Iran wants structural commitments before sitting down.

UNCONFIRMED RUMORS & FORWARD SIGNALS

1. Trump bombing Wednesday if no deal — HIGH significance

- **Claim:** Explicit threat from Air Force One. Ceasefire expires same day.
- **Credibility:** HIGH — Trump on record; IDF ordered “next operation” preparation.
- **Significance:** Creates 3-day countdown to potential resumption of hostilities.

2. IAEA vs intel HEU discrepancy (180 vs 1,200 kg at 20%) — HIGH significance

- **Claim:** Sky News Arabia reports US-Israeli intelligence estimates Iran holds 1,200 kg of 20% enriched uranium vs IAEA’s 180 kg.
- **Credibility:** MODERATE — single source; the gap is enormous.

- **Significance:** If true, Iran is far closer to weapons-grade capability than publicly assessed.

3. Israeli Air Force espionage arrests — HIGH significance

- **Claim:** Two IAF personnel arrested for spying for Iran; recruited by Iranian intelligence to access military systems and high-ranking figures.
- **Credibility:** HIGH — Israeli military police confirmed; follows March Iron Dome spy arrest.
- **Significance:** Iran penetrated Israeli air defense systems during an active war.

4. Mojtaba Khamenei absent 40+ days since appointment — HIGH significance

- **Claim:** The new Supreme Leader has not appeared on audio or video since March 8.
- **Credibility:** HIGH — IDF assessment describes leadership as “fragmented”; multiple cross-locale sources.
- **Significance:** If incapacitated, the IRGC’s operational autonomy is explained — no single political authority constrains the military.

5. Iran ghost fleet generated \$5B for IRGC — MODERATE significance

- **Claim:** UANI tracked 50+ loadings since conflict; 104 tankers at EOPL Malaysia; 34 laden tankers west of Hormuz.
- **Credibility:** HIGH — UANI has documented tracking history.
- **Significance:** The blockade is funding the IRGC even as it degrades Iran’s formal economy.

INFORMATION GAPS

Who fired on the tanker near Oman?

UKMTO confirmed IRGC gunboats, but the separate “unknown projectile” on a container vessel is unattributed. If it was non-IRGC, other actors may be operating in the Strait.

What are the actual Islamabad MOU terms?

Multiple versions circulate. The \$20B, uranium disposition, and enrichment moratorium all remain disputed between the parties.

What is Mojtaba Khamenei’s status?

40+ days without public appearance. If incapacitated, the power structure is fundamentally different from what the diplomatic track assumes.

What happened to the missing tanker?

One tanker stopped transmitting geolocation signals during the U-turn incident. Its status is unknown.

Is the IAEA’s 180 kg estimate or the intelligence community’s 1,200 kg estimate of 20% HEU correct?

This 7x discrepancy is the war’s most consequential intelligence gap.
