

NIGHTWATCH — Iran / Strait of Hormuz Crisis

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The 11-hour overnight cycle ran the 48-hour clock on the 14-point, one-page memorandum of understanding routed through Pakistani mediators down to its inflection. Tehran's formal response — promised by CNN-cited regional sources for Thursday May 7 ([NUR.KZ](#), [NDTV](#)) — arrives squarely inside the window's start, and Parliament Speaker Mohammad Baqer Ghalibaf has preempted it with English-language social-media derision branding the entire exercise "Operation Trust Me Bro / Operation Fauxious" ([News18 Hindi](#), [Reuters](#), [TIME](#)). Foreign Ministry spokesman Esmail Baghaei says the proposal is "still being examined"; Fars dismissed Axios reporting as "fabrications meant to influence oil prices"; National Security Committee spokesman Ebrahim Rezaei labeled the document "more an American wish list than a reality" and warned Iran's "finger is on the trigger" ([Bhaskar Hindi](#), [DW Türkçe](#)).

The destination of Iran's >400 kg near-weapons-grade highly enriched uranium has hardened overnight into a three-way contradiction. Trump told PBS and a Georgia tele-rally that the stockpile "will be transported to the United States. Yes, not 'perhaps'" ([Tagesschau](#), [Süddeutsche](#)); Iranian officials say the IAEA ([Hani](#)); Israeli reporting cited by Saudi outlet Sa.Investing says a "third country" with Russia, China and Turkey floated as candidates ([Sa.Investing](#), [Pravda](#)). Geneva political scientist Hasni Abidi, on franceinfo, introduced a fourth modality: the United States may **purchase** the stockpile rather than merely take delivery ([franceinfo](#)). The formal MOU text is silent on the recipient ([Okaz](#)).

Project Freedom's autopsy is now globally consolidated. NBC reporting reproduced via DW Turkish, the Guardian live blog, the Boston Globe, NDTV, El País and Kikar agree that the operation collapsed inside a 36-to-50 hour window not because of "great progress" toward a deal but because Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, blindsided by Trump's Truth Social rollout, refused use of Prince Sultan Air Base and Saudi airspace, with Kuwait following suit and Saudi Arabia and Pakistan jointly urging suspension ([DW Türkçe](#), [Guardian](#), [Kikar](#), [NDTV](#)). Only three vessels — two US-flagged merchants and a single Maersk vehicle carrier — were escorted before the halt. An Omani diplomat contradicted White House claims that allies were briefed in advance.

The Washington Post 228-structure satellite damage census cleared international press during the window — verified across 109 Iranian-released images cross-checked against Copernicus and Planet imagery, distributed across 15 US bases between Feb 28 and Apr 14, with confirmed losses including an E-3 Sentry AWACS plus a refueling tanker at Prince Sultan, Patriot batteries at Riff/Issa Air Bases (Bahrain) and Ali al-Salem (Kuwait), THAAD radar at Muwaffaq Salti (Jordan), Al Udeid satcom (Qatar) and a NAVCENT 5th Fleet HQ satellite dish in Bahrain — with some Fifth Fleet HQ functions relocated to MacDill AFB Florida ([NV.ua](#), [HuffPost KR](#), [Xataka](#), [NDTV](#)). Khan.co.kr revised the count to 288 assets and explicitly attributed Iranian targeting precision to Russian satellite imagery sharing, an attribution echoed in Hindi News18 ([Khan](#), [hindi.news18.com](#)). At least seven US service members are KIA and 400-plus wounded.

Two load-bearing reframes destabilized the deal narrative. The Economist argued that Tehran’s newly unveiled Persian Gulf Strait Authority — demanding rial-denominated transit tolls, Iranian-bank guarantees, and pre-approval of crews paid in rial — is “a greater threat to a deal than the nuclear file” because it institutionalizes chokepoint sovereignty in a way the 30-day post-signing phase cannot defer; Lloyd’s List records zero Hormuz transits since May 4 ([Economist](#), [CBS News](#)). Israel resumed kinetic action against Hezbollah for the first time since the April 17 Lebanon truce, killing Radwan Force commander Malek Ballout (variant transliteration Malek Balut / Ahmed Ali Balout) in the Beirut Dahieh suburb, with Hezbollah claiming 17 retaliatory strikes against IDF positions and Hamas official Khalil al-Hayya’s son Azzam killed in Gaza City the same window ([BFMTV](#), [Al Jazeera](#), [NewsNation](#)). Brent settled at \$98.77, WTI \$92.61 — both below \$100 — pricing the deal as base case while Maersk’s Vincent Clerc warned of \$500M/month war-tax costs and “a large part of the strait is mined today” ([Sa.Investing](#), [CNBC](#), [AA](#)).

10 MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

1. The 14-point MOU at the 48-hour mark — Pakistani channel substantively thickening

The one-page, 14-point memorandum drafted by Steve Witkoff and Jared Kushner and routed through Islamabad sat on Tehran’s desk through the entire window. Foreign Ministry spokesman Esmail Baghaei told ISNA that Tehran “is still examining” the proposal and will channel its position via Pakistani mediators; Israeli outlet Channel 14 placed the formal Iranian reply “expected today,” tightening the timeline to inside this overnight cycle ([Channel 14](#), [Sabq](#), [Annahar](#)).

The substantive draft, as crystallized across NDTV, El País, RTVI, HuffPost ES and Navbharat Times, contains: (a) formal cessation of hostilities including a Lebanon clause Israel finds intolerable; (b) Hormuz reopening; (c) graduated sanctions relief and frozen-asset release (~\$100bn per ISW); (d) an enrichment moratorium with Iran offering 5 years against US 20 years and a working compromise band of 12-15 years; (e) post-cap enrichment ceiling of 3.67% (the JCPOA limit); (f) IAEA snap inspections; (g) physical transfer of >400 kg of near-weapons-grade HEU; (h) a no-underground-facilities pledge; and (i) a 30-day post-signing window for technical follow-on

negotiations in Islamabad or Geneva ([NDTV English](#), [El País](#), [RTVI](#), [Navbharat Times](#)). Reuters and Internazionale flag that the MOU is silent on Iran's missile program and proxy-militia clauses ([Reuters](#), [Internazionale](#)).

Pakistan's role thickened from facilitator to substantive intermediary inside the window. Geneva-based political scientist Hasni Abidi told franceinfo that Pakistan is now "intervening in the actual content of the discussions"; PM Sharif called the mediation a feat for which "history will remember our efforts in golden words," with Field Marshal Asim Munir credited and a fresh Pakistan-Saudi defense agreement disclosed as the strategic backstop ([franceinfo](#), [Nation PK](#)).

2. HEU destination – three-way contradiction hardens; “purchase” hypothesis introduced

The May 6 SITREP “transfer vs delivery” lexical chasm has now widened to a three-way (and arguably four-way) split. Trump on PBS and at the Burt Jones tele-rally insisted the >400 kg stockpile “will be transported to the United States. Yes, not ‘perhaps’”; Marca and Pressian carry the same line; the Iranian camp via Hani says the recipient is the IAEA; Israeli media circulated through Sa.Investing point to a “third country” – with Russia, China and Turkey all floated; Pravda speculatively names Turkish/Pakistani storage ([Tagesschau](#), [Marca](#), [Pressian](#), [Hani](#), [Sa.Investing](#), [Pravda](#)).

Hasni Abidi (NY Post / franceinfo) introduced a fresh modality: actual US **purchase** of the stockpile rather than mere receipt. Okaz confirms that the formal proposal is silent on the recipient even as Trump fills the silence verbally with US ownership ([franceinfo](#), [Okaz](#)). Stockpile mass appears as “over 400 kg” in Reuters and Arab Weekly, “440 kg” in Pressian and El Periódico – the latter consistent with the Geneva pre-war proposal – with much of the stock reportedly buried inside facilities US/Israeli forces struck in February ([Reuters](#), [Arab Weekly](#), [Pressian](#), [El Periodico](#), [Aljazeera English](#)).

Netanyahu publicly insists the goal remains “complete removal of all enriched material and dismantling enrichment capabilities” – a harder ask than Trump's softer moratorium framing; the Israeli press unified around treating the framework as a “disaster” because the 15-year cap leaves the ballistic program intact and front-loads sanctions relief ([12371.gov.cn](#), [TRT Haber](#), [Yenicag](#)).

3. Project Freedom autopsy – Saudi base/airspace denial confirmed across NBC, Guardian, Kikar

The cause-of-collapse story locked in. NBC reporting reproduced through DW Turkish, the Guardian live blog, the Boston Globe, El País's business desk, NDTV, and Israeli outlet Kikar reconverged on a single causal chain: Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, blindsided by Trump's Truth Social rollout, refused use of Prince Sultan Air Base and overflight of Saudi airspace; Kuwait followed; an MBS phone call with Trump failed; a West Asian diplomat told NDTV the US only coordinated with Oman after the public announcement ([DW Türkçe](#), [Guardian](#), [Boston Globe](#), [Kikar](#), [NDTV](#)).

The operation involved 15,000 troops and ~100 aircraft and collapsed in 36-50 hours per BBC Turkish, El País and Observer/Tortoise; only three vessels (two US-flagged merchants plus a single Maersk vehicle carrier) transited under escort before the halt ([El País](#), [Observer](#), [Bhaskar](#)). Mick Mulroy publicly questioned whether Freedom was halted because of the MOU “or because 1,500 ships remain stuck behind the Strait of Hormuz” ([BBC Turkish](#)). MS.now's postmortem records Gen. Dan Caine's pre-collapse pledge of “dozens of fighter aircraft on standby” and Hegseth's same-morning defense of the operation hours before its cancellation ([MS.now](#)). Iranian drones reportedly struck an Emirati oil tanker shortly after Trump's announcement, forcing Abu Dhabi to spend “two days intercepting missiles” ([Observer](#)).

4. WaPo 228-structure damage census, Khan.co.kr 288 revision, Russia satellite-intelligence link

The Washington Post satellite-imagery investigation became globally reproduced overnight, with parallel framing in NV.ua, HuffPost Korea, Xataka, Guardian, Hani.co.kr and Aaj Tak. The verified count: at least 228 structures or pieces of equipment damaged or destroyed across 15 US bases between Feb 28 and Apr 14 — 217 structures (hangars, barracks, dining facilities, gyms) plus 11 critical equipment items (Patriot batteries, satcom antennas, power plants, fuel storage), derived from over 100 high-resolution satellite images with 109 Iranian-released images cross-verified through Copernicus and Planet Labs. WaPo reports the US government asked Vantor and Planet Labs to “limit, delay or indefinitely withhold” regional imagery from mid-March ([NV.ua](#), [HuffPost KR](#), [Xataka](#), [NDTV](#), [Aaj Tak](#)).

Khan.co.kr revised the figure to “at least 288 US military assets damaged or destroyed across 15 bases” via analysis of “over 120 satellite images,” and introduced the most consequential downstream attribution: WSJ-cited reporting that Russia provided satellite imagery to Iran for targeting US bases. Hindi News18 echoed the Russia attribution; Russian military blogger Alexey Zhivov via news.rambler.ua attributed the targeting precision instead to a “mosaic defense built on Chinese digital satellite technologies” ([Khan](#), [hindi.news18.com](#), [news.rambler.ua](#)). CSIS senior advisor Mark Cancian: “the Iranian attacks were precise. There are no random craters indicating misses.” Stimson’s Kelly Greco: “the U.S. military underestimated Iran’s targeting capability.” William Goodhand notes Iran intentionally targeted “soft targets” — residential, gym, dining structures — to maximize casualties. Specific high-value losses confirmed: an E-3 Sentry AWACS plus refueling tanker at Prince Sultan; THAAD radar at Muwaffaq Salti; nine fuel depots at Ali al-Salem (Kuwait); a NAVCENT 5th Fleet HQ satellite dish in Bahrain (with Fifth Fleet HQ functions partially relocated to MacDill AFB Florida); satcom at Al Udeid; Patriot batteries at Riff and Issa Air Bases (Bahrain). At least 7 US service members KIA (six in Kuwait, one in Saudi Arabia), 400+ wounded ([Hani](#), [Xataka](#)).

5. The Economist’s PGSA reframe and zero Hormuz transits since May 4

The Economist’s analytical reframe is the load-bearing strategic argument of the cycle: Tehran’s newly unveiled Persian Gulf Strait Authority — demanding rial-denominated transit tolls, Iranian-bank guarantees, pre-approved transit, fines up to 20% of cargo value, and seizure rights against vessels from sanctioning states — is “a greater threat to a deal than Iran’s nuclear programme” because it institutionalizes Iranian sovereignty over the chokepoint as a recurring revenue line and forces compliant ships into US-sanctions violation ([Economist](#), [Iran International](#), [ISW](#)).

Lloyd’s List recorded zero Hormuz transits since May 4; CBS News confirmed Pezeshkian has tied any reopening to lifting the US naval blockade first. CENTCOM’s USS George H.W. Bush has now redirected 52+ vessels since the April 13 blockade activation; Iran’s Ports & Maritime Organization is broadcasting fuel/food/medical/repair offers to commercial vessels via VHF Channel 16 three times daily for three consecutive days, positioning Tehran as the de facto safe-passage authority ([CBS News](#), [aa.com.tr Arabic](#), [12371.gov.cn](#)). The IMO has flatly stated maritime escort is “not a sustainable long-term solution,” noting 32 vessels missile-hit since Feb 28 with at least 10 dead and 12 wounded; ~1,600 ships are stranded. CENTCOM via the USS George H.W. Bush group used an F/A-18 Super Hornet 20mm cannon to disable the rudder of the empty Iranian-flagged M/T Hasna in the Gulf of Oman, while a Chinese-owned tanker took a deck-fire hit at the Strait entrance near Al Jeer Port (UAE) on May 4 — the first attack on a Chinese-owned vessel in the war ([Aljazeera Arabic](#), [Swissinfo](#), [A Haber](#)).

6. First Beirut strike since April 17 truce — Radwan commander Ballout killed; Hezbollah retaliates

The Israeli Air Force struck Beirut's Dahieh / southern suburbs in the first IDF action against the Lebanese capital since the April 17 truce, killing Hezbollah Radwan Force operations commander Malek Ballout (transliterated variously as Malek Balut, Ahmed Ali Balout, Ahmed Ali Balut) and his deputy. Hezbollah responded with 17 targeted strikes against Israeli positions in Lebanon; the Lebanese Health Ministry's cumulative tally since March 2 reached 2,715 killed and 8,353 wounded; eleven were killed across eastern and southern Lebanon Wednesday including four (six children among the wounded) at Saksakiyeh between Sidon and Tyre ([BFMTV](#), [Le Parisien](#), [Al Araby](#), [Al Jazeera](#)).

The Guardian recorded three killed in Nabatieh and the killing of Azzam Khalil al-Hayya — fourth son of Hamas's exiled Gaza chief — in Gaza City the same window. Netanyahu's framing per CNN: the strike "underscores the fragility of the truce in Lebanon." IDF Chief of Staff Eyal Zamir said the military "remains on high alert and prepared for a strong, large-scale military operation against Iran"; Channel 14 reports parallel private Israeli-American consultations over fears of "last-minute concessions" ([Guardian](#), [CNN](#), [Channel 14](#)). ISW assessed Hezbollah is "considering the use of suicide operations in southern Lebanon, a tactic the group used frequently during the 1980s and 1990s" ([ISW](#)). Israel Democracy Institute polling: 59% of Israelis say ending the war now is "incompatible with security"; 51% say Washington has more influence on Israeli defense decisions than Jerusalem; 62% expect war with Iran to resume ([Stmegi](#)).

7. The Pezeshkian-IRGC fracture and the absent Mojtaba Khamenei

Iran International reports President Masoud Pezeshkian openly criticized "irresponsible" and uncoordinated IRGC missile/drone strikes against the UAE as "madness," and requested an urgent meeting with Mojtaba Khamenei to halt IRGC attacks on Gulf states "to prevent irreversible consequences" ([Iran International](#)). AA Arabic and Aawsat record Pezeshkian's claim of a 2.5-hour meeting with Mojtaba Khamenei — explicitly framed as refutation of Western claims of severe injury — but the new Supreme Leader has still not appeared publicly, a refutation-via-narration pattern with no independent visual confirmation ([AA Arabic](#), [Aawsat](#)).

ISW assesses IRGC Commander Major General Ahmad Vahidi likely drives operational decision-making "due to his proximity to Supreme Leader Mojtaba Khamenei, despite reports of fragmented decision-making." IRIB is accused by former officials including Mahmoud Mirlohi of functioning as a Paydari Party platform under Vahid Jalili (brother of Saeed Jalili), amplifying radical rhetoric ([ISW](#), [Iran International](#)). The hardliner front flared on cultural lines: Imam Rasul Fallahi of Rasht used a televised speech to label unveiled women "immoral and shameless," prompting Khamenei representative Abdolreza Pourzahabi to publicly rebuke "divisive comments during wartime" ([Panchjanya](#)).

The domestic crackdown is measurable: Channel 14 reports 28 executions in seven weeks for espionage, political activity, or protest participation; CNN Arabic reports 71% of those executions were political/security-related — the June 2022 Mahsa-uprising baseline took three years for 13 executions. Foreign Policy's Saeid Golkar documents IRGC/Basij reclamation of Tehran public space — mobile rallies, "Heydar, Heydar" loudspeaker chants, missile displays, vehicle/cellphone checkpoints for anti-regime content ([Channel 14](#), [arabic.cnn.com](#), [Foreign Policy](#)). UNDP warns up to 41% of the Iranian population could fall below the \$8.30/day poverty line; ~39% of employees work informally; Tehran pharmacies are emptying as medicine prices have risen up to six-fold and basic commodities up to 70%; Iran's Labor Ministry estimates over 1 million jobs lost; ISW's Iranian Oil Ministry source warned onshore/offshore storage "could run out of oil in approximately 40-45 days" under continuing blockade ([RP-Online](#), [Iran International](#), [ISW](#)).

8. China's "Trump as supplicant" frame and the May 14-15 Beijing pacing constraint

Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi conducted a two-day Beijing visit, meeting Wang Yi to consult on a "new post-war regional framework" ahead of the scheduled May 14-15 Trump-Xi summit. Wang Yi told Araghchi China was "deeply hurt" by the conflict and called for an "immediate and full ceasefire" with Hormuz reopening "to secure global energy shipments and sea trade" — but Iran's official readout omitted the Hormuz reopening clause, a notable rejection signal. Lin Jian said China "supports Iran's right to protect its sovereignty" ([Nation PK](#), [RFI Chinese](#), [Haberler](#), [ETV Bharat](#)).

A bipartisan US Senate delegation (Daines, Cantwell, Fischer, Lee, Moran) is currently in Beijing, with Daines explicitly thanking Wang Yi for "urging Iran to resume navigation through the Strait of Hormuz" — the explicit public US acknowledgment that Beijing now has structural leverage. Treasury Secretary Bessent called on China to lean on Iran on Hormuz ([Yahoo Japan](#), [Sa.Investing](#)). Crisis Group's Ali Vaez framed Trump's Beijing trip as "humiliating if the strait remains closed, potentially forcing him to ask China for help"; Guancha and ifeng.com pushed the "Trump as supplicant" / "creditor and debtor" framing into Chinese-language mainstream commentary ([1News](#), [Guancha](#), [news.ifeng.com](#)).

The Chinese counter-leverage map is now visible: per Kpler data, more than half of China's sea-imported crude transits Hormuz; China is taking ~1.2-1.5 mb/d of Iranian crude (~90% of Iran's exports) at \$6-7/bbl below market via Malaysia/Singapore shadow-fleet transfers, paid in yuan; Iran-China CBDC settlement has exceeded \$55 billion (95% in yuan); China's 2025 non-oil trade with the GCC was \$108bn vs \$41.2bn with Iran. China is reportedly considering supplying advanced radar and air defense to Iran, has previously vetoed a Bahrain-led UNSC draft authorizing force for freedom of navigation, and the G7 communique in Paris notably "avoided mentioning the blockage of the Strait of Hormuz or the impact of the Gulf war on global trade to avoid provoking the United States" ([Pakistan Today](#), [Hindi News18](#), [Aljazeera Arabic](#), [Panchjanya](#)).

9. Charles de Gaulle south of Suez; UK-France 30-40 nation coalition forms up

France's nuclear-powered Charles de Gaulle carrier strike group transited the Suez Canal southbound on Wednesday May 6 toward the southern Red Sea / Gulf of Aden in preparation for a UK-France-led multinational Hormuz escort mission separate from the suspended US Project Freedom. Macron framed the deployment as "entirely defensive" — "to be activated only post-ceasefire" — and conditioned military action on (a) reduced threats to ships and (b) restored shipowner/insurer confidence, with consent of neighboring states "including Iran" required (Colonel Guillaume Verne) ([India TV](#), [Al Jazeera English](#), [Le Monde](#)).

The April 17 Paris summit between Macron and Starmer is the strategic precursor; military planners from 30-40 nations have drawn up the operational framework. French FM Jean-Noël Barrot drew an explicit line: "not a single sanction" against Iran will be lifted while Hormuz remains blocked. French Armed Forces Minister Alice Rufo carefully framed France as "not belligerents" — Paris wants Hormuz security carved into a discrete maritime regime separate from the wider US-led nuclear track. Pezeshkian explicitly told Macron Iran's red line: full Hormuz reopening requires lifting the US naval blockade first ([TF1](#), [La Razón](#), [Le Berry](#)).

Macron condemned "unjustified strikes against civilian infrastructure" in the UAE during a call with Pezeshkian, while Vatican-White House friction escalated with Rubio's two-day Rome visit (Pope Leo audience May 8). Trump publicly accused Pope Leo XIV of being "weak on crime," "terrible for foreign policy," and falsely claimed Leo is "OK" with Iran obtaining nuclear weapons; Leo had called Trump's threat to "destroy Iranian civilization" "truly unacceptable"; Cardinal Pietro Parolin called Trump's posture "a bit strange"; PM Meloni and FM Tajani — the EU's #2 trading partner with Iran after Germany — have called the war illegal ([France 24 FR](#), [NBC News](#), [Cathstan](#)). Marquette Law School April 22 polling: 63% of Americans say there were insufficient reasons to go to war with Iran.

10. Markets price the deal – Brent below \$100, Maersk’s \$500M/month war tax, Big Oil \$18bn windfall

Wall Street Wednesday set the Asia open’s table: S&P 500 +1.46%, Nasdaq +2.02%, both at records; Nikkei +5.7-6% to record highs at the Asia open this window. Brent dropped 7.83% to a \$101.27 close (peak-to-trough \$126 → ~\$97 intraday low, an 11% maximum extension); Thursday Brent settled \$98.77 / WTI \$92.61 – both below \$100 ([BFMTV](#), [Sa.Investing](#), [CBS News](#), [El País](#)).

Maersk CEO Vincent Clerc quantified the war tax: ~\$500 million in extra monthly costs at oil near \$100; Q1 EBITDA \$1.73-1.75bn beat consensus \$1.66bn but down sharply from \$2.71bn YoY; pre-tax profit collapsed to \$292M from \$1.43B; revenue -2.6% to \$12.97B; full-year operating range now spans an operating loss of \$1.5B to a profit of \$1B – “highly uncertain” and “probably the most comprehensive energy shock, at least in our lifetimes.” Crucially, Clerc said “a large part of the strait is mined today” and Maersk’s remaining Persian Gulf vessels “will stay there as long as the situation is unsafe.” Hapag-Lloyd is hemorrhaging ~\$60M per week; Khor Fakkan throughput has surged from 2,000 to ~50,000 containers per week and from a few hundred to ~7,000 trucks per day as Jebel Ali traffic collapses – GulfTainer CEO Farid Belbouab characterizes the shift as a permanent capital reallocation from cost optimization to security ([CNBC](#), [AA](#), [Independent](#), [Bloomberg HT](#)).

The corporate quarter splits cleanly along the supply-chain. Shell Q1 adjusted earnings \$6.92bn (>2× Q4 2025 \$3.26bn), beating \$6.36bn consensus; the \$16.4bn ARC Resources acquisition is in motion; net debt \$45.7bn → \$52.6bn; gearing 20.7% → 23.2%; buyback cut \$3.5bn → \$3bn; dividend +5%; TotalEnergies +51% to \$5.8bn; BP \$3.8bn (>2× YoY); ConocoPhillips +84% to \$2.3bn; Liberty Energy +32%. Greenpeace pegs Europe’s four oil majors at \$18bn+ adjusted earnings (+80% QoQ) with Oxfam projecting “\$94bn in profits in 2026” for the largest oil firms. Five EU states (Germany, Italy, Spain, Austria, Portugal) are pushing an EU-wide windfall tax. Bonny Light is +66% to \$116.84/bbl; Goldman Sachs estimates global oil production has declined by 14.5 mb/d (a 57% decline) due to Hormuz disruption and energy infrastructure attacks ([Daily Sabah](#), [Euobserver](#), [Guardian](#), [Aljazeera English](#)). - **Two missiles hit a US warship** during the Project Freedom window per ifeng.com and GNN (CN-zh / PK-en) vs “two destroyers repelled an attempted Iranian attack” per Navbharat Times citing two US officials. The Chinese / Pakistani version is corroborated nowhere in US-aligned reporting and is the largest single fact-gap of the cycle ([news.ifeng.com](#), [GNN](#), [Navbharat Times](#)).
- **Russia satellite imagery vs Chinese satellite technology** as the targeting-precision attribution: KR-ko (Khan) and IN-hi (News18) carry the WSJ-cited Russia line; RU-ru (news.rambler.ua) attributes targeting to Chinese mosaic-defense tech.

- **HMM “Namu”** Iranian-attack pretext: Trump’s claim survives only in US executive statement; Iranian Embassy Seoul “categorically denies”; HMM denies the operational predicate (vessel was sailing); BBC Korean adds the labor-union-uncertainty angle. The pretext for further escalation is undercut.
- **“Operation Trust Me Bro” mockery** is bilingual: Ghalibaf posted in English on X; Hindi (News18), Turkish (BBC Turkish, Hurriyet), French (boursier), Korean (Hani) and English (TIME, LBC, Aljazeera, Arab Weekly) outlets all carry the line. The variant “Operation Fauxious” / “Operation Foxious” / “Operation Fauxios” appears across locales.
- **Khamenei status** as fact-stratification: Hindi News18 still asserts Ali Khamenei was killed in “Operation Epic Fury” with no update on succession; Hurriyet, IndiaTV, Foreign Policy, La Voz de Galicia, Zee News, Agora and CNN treat Ali Khamenei’s death as established fact and Mojtaba Khamenei as the active Supreme Leader; ISW, Aawsat and AA-Arabic operate on the Mojtaba premise but Mojtaba has yet to make a public appearance in this window — Pezeshkian’s reported 2.5-hour meeting is refutation-via-narration.

HEU destination — three (or four) ways

Trump on PBS and at the Burt Jones tele-rally: HEU “will be transported to the United States. Yes, not ‘perhaps’” ([Tagesschau](#), [Marca](#)). Iranian officials per Hani: destination is the IAEA. Israeli reporting via Sa.Investing: a “third country” with Russia, China, Turkey floated. franceinfo’s Hasni Abidi: possible US **purchase**. The formal proposal is silent on the recipient ([Hani](#), [Sa.Investing](#), [franceinfo](#), [Okaz](#)).

Trump-Rubio operation status: ended or paused?

Rubio: “Operation Epic Fury / Epic Wrath has reached its objectives and concluded” — defensive posture ([TRT Haber](#)). Trump on PBS and Truth Social: if Iran refuses, “the bombing starts” again at “much higher and more intense level” ([WMUR](#)). IDF Chief Zamir: “high alert, prepared for strong, large-scale operation against Iran.” Hegseth same morning as halt was defending Project Freedom; CENTCOM remains tactically kinetic on M/T Hasna and six small-boat sinkings ([1News](#), [MS.now](#)).

Project Freedom: deal-driven pause or Saudi denial?

Trump and White House: paused for “great progress” toward agreement. NBC reproduced via DW Turkish, Guardian, Boston Globe, Kikar, NDTV, Independent: Saudi Arabia and Kuwait refused base/airspace; MBS persuasion failed; West Asian diplomat told NDTV US only coordinated with Oman after public announcement ([DW Türkçe](#), [Guardian](#), [Kikar](#), [NDTV](#)). Mick Mulroy: “1,500 stuck ships” question undercut the official frame ([BBC Turkish](#)).

“Two missiles hit US warship” vs “Iranian attack repelled”

Chinese ([ifeng.com](#)) and Pakistani ([GNN](#)) reporting: two missiles hit a US warship attempting to enter Hormuz; six Iranian boats sunk in retaliation. Navbharat Times citing two US officials: two destroyers crossed into Persian Gulf and “successfully repelled” Iranian attack before halt ([news.ifeng.com](#), [GNN](#), [Navbharat Times](#)).

HMM “Namu” sailing claim vs Korean denial

Trump (May 4): Iran “took some shots at the vessel”; vessel was sailing. Iranian Embassy Seoul: “categorically denies.” HMM operator: contradicts Trump’s claim that the vessel was sailing at the incident time. BBC Korean: HMM Maritime Labor Union chairman Jeon Jeong-geun says tensions made it impossible to determine internal vs external cause ([aa.com.tr Arabic](#), [El Mundo](#), [BBC Korean](#)).

Khamenei: alive, dead, or succeeded?

Hindi News18: Ali Khamenei “killed” in Operation Epic Fury — no successor mentioned. Hurriyet, IndiaTV, ZeeNews, Agora, La Voz de Galicia, Foreign Policy: Ali Khamenei died Feb 28 in US-Israeli bombing of Tehran. Profinance, ISW, Aawsat, AA-Arabic: Mojtaba Khamenei is the active Supreme Leader. Pezeshkian claims a 2.5-hour meeting with Mojtaba — refutation-via-narration; Mojtaba has not appeared publicly. Okaz cites US officials: Mojtaba “currently hiding,” explaining response delay ([hindi.news18.com](#), [Foreign Policy](#), [Profinance](#), [Okaz](#)).

“Operation Epic Fury” vs “Epic Wrath” naming

TIME, NV.ua, Antena 3, Konhaber, Serbestiyet: “Operation Epic Fury” ([TIME](#), [NV.ua](#)). Asharq Arabic and Masrawy: “Operation Epic Wrath” ([Asharq](#), [Masrawy](#)). Aawsat parallel-uses “Operation Epic Wrath.” Naming inconsistency itself is a contradiction signal.

228 vs 288 damage tally

WaPo investigation as carried by Hani, NV.ua, HuffPost KR, Xataka, Guardian, Aaj Tak, NDTV English: 228 structures or pieces of equipment across 15 bases (217 structures + 11 equipment). Khan.co.kr (KR-ko): 288 assets across 15 bases via “over 120 satellite images.” NBC: 100 targets across 11 bases; CNN: 16 damaged locations; NYT: 14 — order-of-magnitude divergence between civilian estimates and official US silence ([NDTV](#), [Khan](#)).

“Transfer” vs “delivery” of HEU

Reuters Arabic, RTÉ, Annahar: “transfer” / “transport”; Channel 14: “shipped from Iran directly to the United States”; Trump: “we are going to get it” / “delivery.” RTVI / Axios original framing: still-open contention between “export” and “transfer.” The lexical chasm has narrowed but not closed; Iranian text in working drafts says “transfer,” US drafts say “delivery” ([Reuters AR](#), [Channel 14](#), [RTVI](#)).

intervention; gold +\$115 in hours. Framing explicitly raises insider trading suspicion toward “people within the Donald Trump administration.” Watch for OFAC/DOJ probe announcement ([NDTV Hindi](#), [Erem Business](#)).

GCC-Ukraine drone deals + Israeli “Iron Dome” supply to UAE – MEDIUM

BBC Arabic via Alwasat: Saudi/UAE/Qatar entered defense agreements with Ukraine for drones and EW during Zelenskyy’s March visit; Israel reportedly provided UAE with an “Iron Dome”-style air defense system and personnel at war start. Saudi US investment commitments grew from \$600B to \$1T including a \$142B arms package. King’s College London’s Dr. Andreas Craig: war “weakens trust in Washington” even as it “may strengthen reliance on the US in the short term” ([Alwasat](#), [BBC Arabic](#)).

Pakistan-Saudi defense pact disclosed – HIGH

PM Sharif explicitly cited a fresh Pakistan-Saudi defense agreement as “reaffirmation of resolve to protect the Harmain Sharifain” – implicit hedge against US given Saudi Prince Sultan revocation. Andrabi: “If an agreement is signed in Pakistan, it will be an honor for us.” Pakistan-hosted signing remains the live alternative to Geneva ([Nation PK](#), [Armenpress](#)).

MQ-9 wreckage video – LOW-MEDIUM

n-tv: Iran released footage timestamped 13:47 May 7 (inside this window) claiming MQ-9 debris in Hormuz; authenticity unconfirmed. If validated, third such MQ-9 loss historically ([n-tv](#)).

Sina Finance “Weekend Curse” / dismissals / fires – LOW (single-source)

Sina Finance flags Trump’s M-F conciliatory tone vs weekend belligerence; identifies USS Lincoln/USS Tripoli food-and-hygiene complaints; names dismissals of Army Chief Randy George and Navy Secretary “John Feren”; lists fires on USS Ford and USS Eisenhower March 12-April 27. Not corroborated by US-aligned outlets in the cycle; needs cross-confirmation but consistent with the Aawsat USS Ford laundry-fire / Norfolk-steaming detail ([Sina Finance](#), [Aawsat](#)).

LaSexta “third Trump assassination attempt” – LOW (single-source)

LaSexta El Intermedio references “the third attempt” on Trump’s life at a Washington correspondents’ dinner. Not corroborated by US-domestic outlets in the cycle; but DHS Office of Intelligence and Analysis Apr 27 preliminary assessment (per Indyturk and Naidunia) does link Cole Thomas Allen’s April 25 White House Correspondents Dinner shooting (one Secret Service agent wounded) to Iran-war motivation, with a Bluesky post (“Tonight a civilization will cease to exist”) ([LaSexta](#), [Indyturk](#)).

Khamenei status – UNRESOLVED

Mojtaba Khamenei still has not appeared publicly. The HEU recipient clause.

The MOU text is silent; Trump’s PBS / Truth Social statements are unilateral. Whether the recipient is the US (delivery), the US (purchase), the IAEA, or a “third country” (Russia/China/Turkey) is the load-bearing operational question for both Iranian face-saving and Israeli acceptance.

Whether two missiles actually hit a US warship during Project Freedom’s brief life.
