

# SITREP — Iran / Strait of Hormuz Crisis

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Twenty-four hours before the ceasefire expires, the conflict has entered a state that can only be described as **pre-war in ceasefire clothing**. Both sides are firing on each other's ships. Iran rejected the talks meant to extend the truce. Trump threatened to destroy every power plant and bridge in Iran — then claimed a deal would be signed “tonight.” An Axios investigation revealed a devastating assessment: **the United States does not know who is in charge in Tehran**. The IRGC has sidelined the diplomats; the FM and Parliament Speaker issue contradictory statements; Mojtaba Khamenei hasn't appeared in 43 days. Trump's own delegation composition remains confused — four contradictory official statements about VP Vance's attendance — and CNN/NYT report the team hasn't even departed for Islamabad despite Trump claiming they're “en route.”

Strait of Hormuz traffic collapsed to **3 vessels Monday** — down from 24 on Saturday and 135/day pre-war. **Kuwait declared force majeure** on its oil export contracts. Iran admits to mining the Strait and is charging up to **\$2M per vessel** for IRGC-authorized passage. The 260 tankers stranded in the Gulf now carry an estimated **135 million barrels** of trapped crude. Citigroup projects global oil inventories could hit **25-year lows** within weeks. IEA Director Birol called it “the largest energy crisis we have ever faced.” Brent settled near **\$97/barrel** (+7% on the day, +31% since war start); Dubai physical crude remains above \$150. US gasoline at \$4.08; diesel +54%.

Xi Jinping made his **first post-war call with Saudi Crown Prince MBS**, calling for a “comprehensive ceasefire” — positioning China as the mediator-of-last-resort after the US-Pakistan track collapsed. Russia detained **~40 Israeli citizens at Moscow airport**, explicitly linking the action to the Russia-Iran alliance — the most direct Russian retaliation against Israel since the war began. A CRINK axis (China-Russia-Iran-North Korea) is crystallizing: Chinese spy satellite used for targeting, missile components flowing, North Korean tech transfers documented. The petrodollar is under structural stress — UAE's yuan pivot threat, Iran charging tolls in cryptocurrency, CIPS yuan volumes at records.

Domestically, Trump's approval sits at **37%** with **67% disapproving** his Iran handling — a 13-point jump since March. A CNN fact-check documented multiple false claims in a 4-post Truth Social blitz where Trump declared “crushing victory.” The WSJ investigation of staff managing Trump out of his own war room continues to dominate media framing. Democratic calls for the 25th Amendment

surfaced. Rep. Joe Kent resigned over Israeli pressure. Veterans protested at the Capitol. The War Powers 60-day clock runs to **May 1** — 11 days. The House failed to pass a War Powers resolution by **1 vote** (213-214).

The ceasefire expires **Wednesday evening Washington time** (00:00 GMT Apr 22). Trump said extension is “highly unlikely” without a signed deal. He said “lots of bombs start going off” if no agreement. Iran says it won’t attend talks unless the blockade is lifted. The US delegation’s departure is unconfirmed. The last 24 hours before expiry have produced no de-escalation signal from either side. This is the final SITREP before the deadline.

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## 10 MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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### 1. Ceasefire expires in ~24 hours — Trump says extension “highly unlikely,” threatens bombing

Trump stated on Fox News that extending the ceasefire without a signed deal is “highly unlikely” and warned: “If they don’t sign this document... lots of bombs start going off.” He simultaneously claimed a deal could be signed “tonight” — directly contradicted by Iran’s stated refusal to attend. The ceasefire expires 00:00 GMT Wednesday (Apr 22). No extension mechanism has been publicly agreed. Both sides have already fired on each other’s ships during the current “ceasefire” period ([Fox News](#), [DW](#)).

### 2. Strait traffic collapses to 3 vessels; Kuwait declares force majeure

MarineTraffic data shows only **3 commercial ships** transited the Strait of Hormuz on Monday — down from 24 Saturday and 135/day pre-war. Kuwait formally declared force majeure on its oil export contracts — the first Gulf state to take this legal step. Iran admits to mining the Strait and charges \$2M per IRGC-authorized passage. 260 tankers stranded; ~135M barrels of crude trapped in the Gulf. The Strait is functionally closed despite being technically “passable” ([Multiple agent reports]).

### 3. Axios: “US does not know who is in charge in Tehran”

An Axios investigation revealed the US intelligence community’s central problem: it cannot identify a single decision-maker in post-Khamenei Iran. The IRGC (Vahidi) and civilian/parliamentary leadership (Ghalibaf, Araghchi) are issuing contradictory orders. The IRGC fired on tankers after the FM declared the Strait open. Mojtaba Khamenei hasn’t appeared publicly in 43 days. The US may be negotiating with a faction that cannot deliver what it agrees to ([Axios via agent reports]).

### 4. US delegation departure unconfirmed — 4 contradictory statements on Vance continue

Trump claims Vance/Witkoff/Kushner are “en route” to Islamabad. CNN and NYT report the delegation has **not departed**. Reports suggest Vance may not attend due to Secret Service concerns about Pakistani security. The NY

Post named only Witkoff and Kushner. Pakistan deployed 10,000+ security forces for talks that may not happen. Iran's IRNA formally rejected attendance but Pakistani sources insist Iran will come ([Multiple agent reports]).

## **5. Xi Jinping calls MBS — first post-war engagement; China positions as mediator-of-last-resort**

Xi made his first phone call with Saudi Crown Prince MBS since the war began, calling for a “comprehensive ceasefire” and offering Chinese mediation. This positions Beijing as the fallback after the US-Pakistan-mediated track collapsed. Saudi Arabia is seeking Chinese guarantees for Hormuz passage if the US blockade continues. Combined with the UAE yuan pivot threat, the petrodollar architecture is under structural stress for the first time since 1974 ([Agent reports]).

## **6. Russia detains ~40 Israelis at Moscow airport — explicit Russia-Iran alliance signal**

Russian security services detained approximately 40 Israeli citizens at Sheremetyevo Airport, explicitly linking the action to the Russia-Iran partnership. This is the most direct Russian retaliation against Israel since the war began and signals Moscow is willing to escalate asymmetrically on Iran's behalf. Separately, Israel foiled an IRGC plot against the Baku-Tbilisi-Ceyhan pipeline — an escalation attempt targeting energy infrastructure outside the war zone ([Agent reports]).

## **7. Oil at \$95-97; Citigroup: inventories could hit 25-year lows; \$50B+ lost**

Brent settled near \$97/bbl (+7% day, +31% since war). WTI \$87-90. Dubai physical crude >\$150. US gasoline \$4.08 (+35.5%); diesel +54%. Citigroup projects global inventories could hit 25-year lows within weeks if Hormuz stays closed. The 52-day war has now removed **500M+ barrels** worth **\$50B+** from global markets — the largest energy supply disruption in modern history. IEA's Birol: “the largest energy crisis we have ever faced” ([CNBC](#), [Multiple]).

## **8. Trump 4-post Truth Social blitz: “crushing victory” — CNN documents multiple false claims**

Trump posted four times declaring the war a “crushing victory,” claiming Iran agreed to hand over uranium, that the Strait is open, and that no money will change hands. CNN fact-checked each claim as false or unverifiable. Trump simultaneously denied that Israel dragged him into the war — contradicted by Secretary of State Rubio's earlier public statement and NYT reporting. The gap between presidential rhetoric and operational reality has never been wider ([CNN via agent reports]).

## **9. CRINK axis crystallizing: China spy satellite, NK tech, missile components flowing**

Multiple intelligence assessments document a deepening China-Russia-Iran-North Korea (CRINK) axis: Chinese TEE-01B spy satellite used for targeting US bases; missile component deliveries via third countries; North Korean technology transfers documented; Russia sharing intelligence on US positions. China offered both weapons support (X-band radar, MANPADS) and nuclear custody (440 kg HEU) — positioning to dominate post-war security architecture regardless of outcome ([CBS/DIA via agent reports]).

## 10. Domestic fracture: 25th Amendment calls, Joe Kent resignation, veterans at Capitol

Democratic lawmakers raised the 25th Amendment after the WSJ war-room exposé. Rep. Joe Kent (R-WA), a Trump loyalist and veteran, resigned his position citing “unacceptable Israeli pressure” on the administration’s war decisions. Veterans staged protests at the Capitol. Trump’s approval at 37% with 67% disapproving Iran handling. The House War Powers vote failed by 1 vote (213-214). The domestic political floor is collapsing faster than the ceasefire ([NBC News](#), [Agent reports]).

## INFORMATION GAPS

### Will Iran attend Islamabad?

The single most consequential unknown. IRNA says no; Pakistani sources say yes. 24 hours remain.

### Has the US delegation departed?

Trump says yes; CNN/NYT say no. If they haven’t left, Tuesday talks are physically impossible.

### Who actually controls Iran?

Axios confirms the US intelligence community cannot identify a single decision-maker. This is not a gap we can close — it may be a structural reality.

### What happens at 00:00 GMT Wednesday?

If no extension and no deal: does bombing resume immediately? Does the blockade escalate? Does Israel strike independently?

### Is the CRINK axis operational or aspirational?

Chinese radar offered but delivery unconfirmed. NK tech transfers documented but scale unclear. The axis may be tighter than publicly assessed.
